

> GENERAL INFORMATION

Academic requirements

Applications are open on a rolling-basis from 1st February of each year until the start of the LL.M programme in mid-September (early applications are however recommended). The LL.M class is limited to 30 students.

The LL.M. in European Competition and IP law is open to all applicants holding a Bologna Master's degree in law or a degree that is deemed equivalent by the admissions commission (i.e. a 300 ECTS or 5 years educational programme in law).

Languages

To follow the LL.M programme, a sound working knowledge of French and English languages is indispensable.

Fees
